

Harsch, Barbara Trezona, Mary Champney, Marcine Dubois, Beverly Yerby, Jeff Graves, Lorraine Mayfield-Brown, Jodee Craig; and others: Joanne Nelson, Lynda Olsen, Betty Jacobson, Dawn Curtis, & OUMC staff, contributed snacks, desserts, drinks, etc. We, along with the NOMADS, can't thank everyone enough for all the time, effort, thoughtfulness and love everyone put into making these 3 weeks so meaningful and helpful to all the NOMADS and volunteers.

These are just some of the many tremendous things the NOMADS and volunteers accomplished in just 12 days:

- On east side of Sanctuary, removed all Holly bushes, removed a 3" layer of dirt, laid landscape fabric & chicken wire to hold 2 yards of river rock. Installed land-scape lighting. A must see at night! This was about a 12-hour job on tired knees!
- Prayer Garden: Poured a concrete sidewalk in front of maintenance office & removed old landscaping adjacent to it, replacing it with sod and Day Lilies.
- Pressure washed walls, brick walkway & sidewalks to remove rust stains, etc. Pressure washed all fencing, repaired and/or replaced broken fencing in area behind Fellowship Hall kitchen and dumpster area. Re-stained split rail fence and mailbox post. All look brand new now!
- Removed dead Sweet Gum tree, trimmed numerous trees and bushes. Hauled 2 loads of tree limbs, bushes, other debris to the dump. We had to order an extra dumpster pick up there was so much left over.
- Replaced damaged portico facia trim & drip flashing, caulked and painted.
- Scraped bubbled paint on Sanctuary walls, sealed and repainted.
- ♦ Made a Day Lily garden around the electronic sign. Spruced up other garden areas.
- ♦ Repaired/redesigned/rebuilt/painted playground equipment.
- Repaired & painted 10 picnic tables. Repaired & painted bench & deck by playground.
- Shampooed carpet, stripped & sealed vinyl flooring; patched, primed, painted Room 16. Touched up other classrooms, and various walls throughout church including retexturing & painting a damaged wall by Sanctuary.
- Bill & Sandy Fussner did a deep cleaning of the Foundry kitchen, pulling equipment away from the walls, cleaned walls, equipment, and pressure washed the floor.

Thank you to all our wonderful volunteers. This would not have been possible without you! Thank you to those who contributed money to defray some of the costs of these projects as well.
