#### A WINDOW OF NEEDLEPOINT

Several years ago when the Worship Commission asked me to design a permanent hanging for the Sanctuary, I was completely at a loss for ideas. The Bridge Fellowship would provide funding for whatever supplies were needed.

Ideas were slow in coming, but what you see today is the result of many hands work. Claris Hillier, Joyce Tarkenton and I did the needlepoint stitching; Betty Stricker provided the gold frame and lining; Jim



Szenas built the inner stretcher frame (3 times) and the gold frame; Bridge Fellowship bought the canvas and wool; and Fred Michel hung it securely on the wall.

Look closely at the figures in the needlepoint:

The CROSS AND FLAME is, of course, the Methodist symbol; the cross is the central symbol of our faith. The flame represents God's presence in our midst, as well as the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and the movement of the Church out into the world. The basketweave stitch shows up this section, appliqued to the center portion of the hanging.

The LAMB OF GOD WITH THE BANNER OF VICTORY, also know as AGNUS DEI, symbolizes Christ, victorious over sin and death. The background is stitched in purple, the color of royalty, in the brick stitch.

The SHIP AND DOVE represents the congregation of believers on the stormy sea of life; the dove depicts the help of the Holy Spirit available to us all. The blue background, stitched in the Scotch stitch, represents heavenly love.

The CROSS AND DESCENDING DOVE, in mosaic stitch, echoes the central theme of the Christian faith—the crucifixion and resurrection of Christ. The descending dove always stands for the Holy Spirit, as at Christ's baptism and at Pentecost. In the Old Testament the color red means life; in the New Testament red stands for martyrdom.

The CHALICE AND WHEAT remind us of the cup from which Christ drank at the Last Supper and our observance of Holy Communion in remembrance of Him. Green is the color of renewal and regeneration. The Hungarian stitch shows circles of renewal, also, in the background.

The geometric border binds these all together in unity. Gold stands for the majesty of God and white for holiness and purity.

This needlepoint hanging is lovingly presented to Oakhurst United Methodist Church on October 30, 1994, and dedicated to the glory of God.
