We are fighting a war against this strange viral enemy - can there be peace during this battle? I got to thinking about inner peace and health and our faith. Jesus is the Prince of Peace.

A lack of inner peace - anxiety - causes out nervous, endocrine, cardiovascular and immune systems to interact in ways negative to health. High blood pressure, irritable bowels, ulcers, heart disease, pain, insomnia, headaches are some of the physical ailments linked to anxiety. Uncontrolled anxiety can lead to panic attacks and a fight or flight response leading to aggressiveness behavior or retreat. It can lead to being irritable and aggressive.

It is no wonder many are experiencing more health challenges these days, and more irritable people expressing their irritation (maybe even we, ourselves, are expressing more irritability?)

If you are experiencing uncontrolled irritability, it may be time to talk to a professional about it. Medical advice suggests the following to "nip" anxiety - lack of inner peace - in the bud:

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you." Philippians 4:6-9
