Hello to our Friends and Family,

Sometime between 1360 and 1387 (just a few years ago), William Langland wrote a narrative poem called Piers Plowman. In that poem he said, "patience is a virtue." Although most people today do not know about Langland, there probably isn't anyone who has not heard that phrase. All of us are practicing patience these days. Some better than others!

The virtues listed by Pope Gregory in AD 590 to counterbalance the seven deadly sins do not include patience. Those virtues are Faith, Hope, Charity, Fortitude, Justice, Prudence and Temperance. Paul, in Galatians talks about the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.
