KENYA UPDATE AUGUST 2021

To my lovely church family!

I greet you all in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ

I want to sincerely appreciate the moral, spiritual and financial support you have continuously accorded. It has meant a great deal to me and in fact has brought me through a difficult year dealing with sickness, anxiety, and physically adjusting to the food and sometimes harsh environment here. I thank God for you every day as between you and my Kenya church family I am truly blessed. Praise be to God I am doing well now and strong in the Lord.

I am delighted to report that the project at Tabata where we are building the school for children with disabilities is progressing well. When I first arrived in November 2019 there was a lot of work completed on the renovation of the existing buildings and the building of the washrooms addition with the donation we had sent over earlier. One of the first jobs I had to do was to get with the Synod office accounting clerk and sort out all the receipts and teach him how to manage the online accounting system that I had set up. Through working together, we were able to balance the accounts and upload all the receipts and that is something I monitor each week as we receive donations and buy materials and continue work. His accounting methods and knowledge have grown by being involved in this mission so God is always working in more ways than just the project. I have also been assisting other mission activities like planting new churches which has given me a lot of fulfillment. This is one of the things I really enjoy about being on mission doing Gods' work.

The project was held up a little this year as the Reverend heading our project team came down with Covid very severely and was in hospital on oxygen. It took about 6 weeks for him to be well enough to work, but we thank God that he has healed and is strong now.

To date we have completed all the renovations including the washroom additions and roof, all electrical work and fittings, all plumbing and fittings and drainage. We have installed a water tank and supporting tower and have connected to the local water supply, which originates from a river nearby. It was exciting last month to see the place really becoming useable, with toilets and showers and basins all in place and running water! We still have to do all the finishing work to the buildings which includes 2 dormitories, the 2 washroom areas and 3 classrooms. This includes, painting, tiling, additional concreting and leveling of floor spaces etc. After that we need to construct a temporary kitchen and store room which will be satisfactory for the opening of this Phase I of the project. Once this is complete then we will need to purchase all the supplies; beds and linens/pillows etc., desks and chairs, teacher's desks and chairs, educational materials. Once everything is almost complete we will then be inspected by the government to ensure we are certified. We are working on the registration of the school currently. As this is a church/government school we will receive teachers from the government for free and also as I understand some of the educational materials.

Our synod disability committee has a special needs teacher who will be assisting with the set-up of the actual curriculum and the process of assessment for the children that will be accepted at this school which is focused on physical disabilities. The long-term goal of the school is to not only educate but to teach life skills and crafts/trades that will allow the students to support their upkeep at school by selling the same and as they get older to be able to make their way in the community.

I am currently working on planning an educational community meeting, led by the area Chief to educate the surrounding villages on disability, to alleviate the problem of the old myths and beliefs that these children are a curse. To let them know what is available to them from the government (there is a countrywide register and financial help available including wheelchairs and crutches too) and where they can go for assistance, and of course, to let them know about the school. We will co-ordinate this with the area Chief, the government representative, the area Reverends and the Synod disability committee so that there will be great coverage of all aspects of life with disability and the acceptance and empowerment that needs to generate through the community.

Thank you all so much for being part of this Kingdom project through your prayers and donations. As you can see, we, as a church are achieving something wonderful here in this rural community, and I wish you were here to see the excitement and appreciation of the people who live in this area.
