

Dear Oakhurst UMC,

Over the past several months, we have made mention in our worship services that the Thrift Shoppe space will be transitioning towards becoming a Foster Closet under the leadership of the United Women in Faith. Three weeks ago, a closeout sale happened to help clean out the Thrift Shoppe of all the items that won't be carried by the new Foster Closet moving forward. A lot went in to that sale and a lot has gone in to that space since the sale to help this transition happen.

Before we prepare the new Foster Closet for launch, I wanted to write this letter to you to share some of the history of the Thrift Shoppe and express our congregation's gratitude for those who helped make this valuable ministry happen.

The Thrift Shoppe was set up in 2008 by Barbara Talbot. For much of the history of the Thrift Shoppe, one person at a time has taken on the responsibility for coordinating the staffing, receiving and sorting the donations, and organizing the space. Often this person drew on their connections in the congregation and community to recruit volunteers to assist in these efforts. Others after Barbara Talbot who took on the task of being the point person in charge of the Thrift Shoppe included Jane Blain, Doris Branch, and Billie Lee Norman. Our great thanks go to these wonderful women who helped make the Oakhurst Thrift Shoppe a possibility.

Most of the items carried by the Thrift Shoppe were donated by members and friends of Oakhurst over the years. These items would be cleaned up, sometimes repurposed, and find new homes after being sold at low cost (usually \$2-\$3). And yet, despite the sales price of most items, the Thrift Shoppe raised over \$34,200 over the years and returned much of that to the church for special projects in our times of need. Projects supported by this income have included: purchasing a new computer during Covid to aid in development of our online worship services, contributing towards new A/C purchases, helping to renovate the Fellowship Hall flooring, purchase of the new church truck, supporting the work of the NOMADS, and other valuable items and projects that have enhanced our mission and ministry over the years. The Thrift Shoppe has been a blessing to Oakhurst UMC for 14 years.

As we prepare to make this transition from Thrift Shoppe to Foster Closet in the coming weeks, we want to pause this Sunday to recognize all of you who have volunteered your time, your talent, and your energy to support the Thrift Shoppe. We will have special moments of recognition at both services and we hope to share our great thanks with you at that time. While we look forward to the way in which our congregation will be able to provide for children and families in moments of crisis and need in our community, we gratefully acknowledge the care and ministry that has happened over the last nearly decade and a half in this Thrift Shoppe space.
